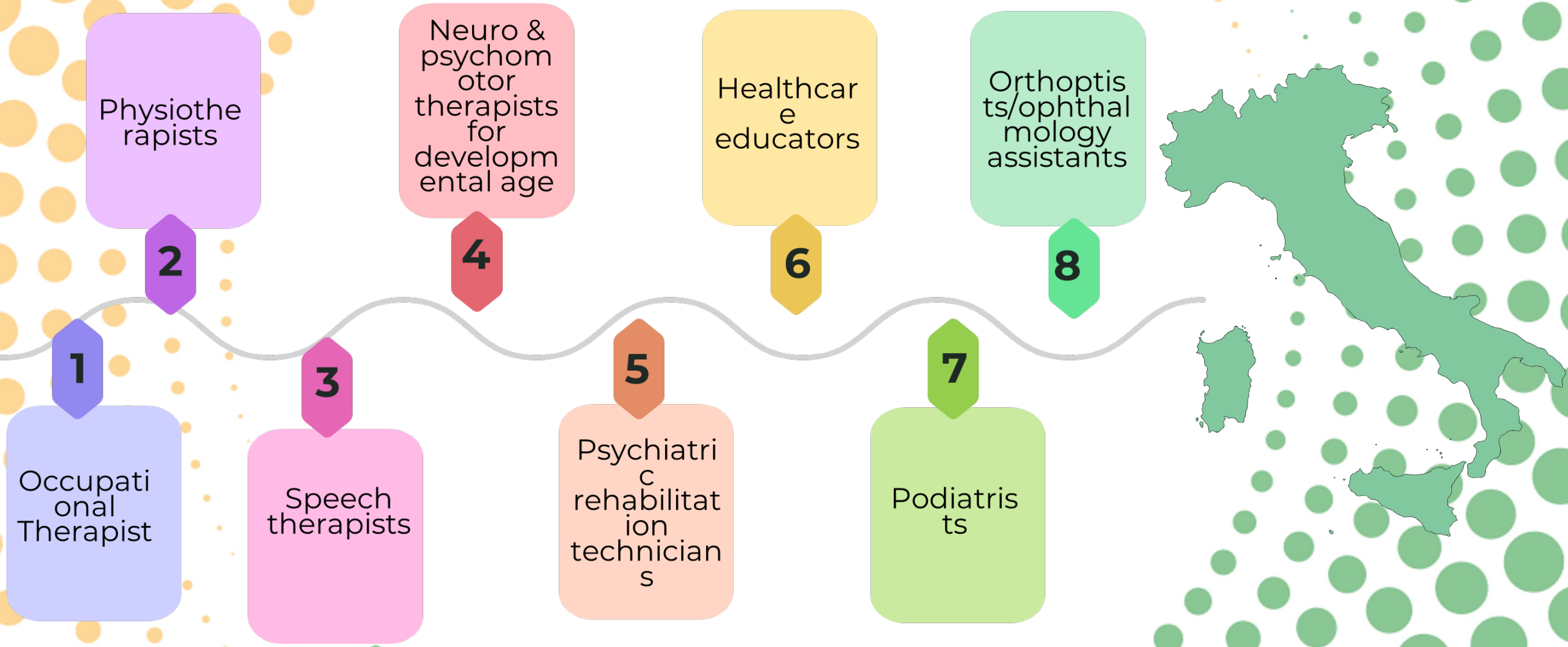

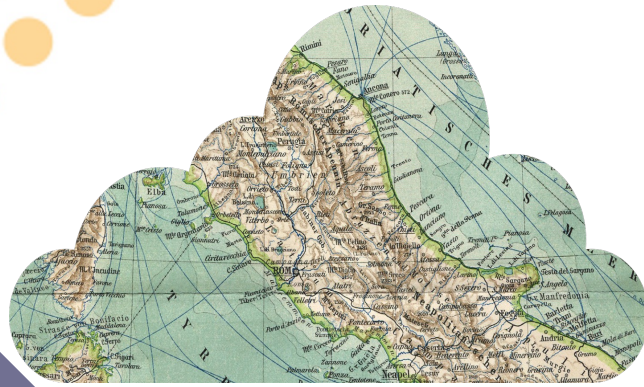

**Fragmentation of skills  
and Operational  
overlap .**

Rehabilitation  
interventions, involve  
multiple professions.

**Variability of  
rehabilitation across  
territories.** Access to  
rehabilitation and the  
type of interventions  
offered can depend  
significantly on the  
area of residence,  
rather than on the  
person's functional  
needs.

**High variability  
in care  
pathways**

**Difficulties in  
building  
consistent  
national standards**



# Package of interventions for Rehabilitation

The WHO Packages do not redefine professional roles

They can support: the reading of the existing offer, the comparison between territories, the planning of services



They offer a shared reference on essential rehabilitation interventions

Goal: Greater consistency, readability and integration, not rigid standardization

The WHO Packages support service planning by linking essential interventions with the professional competencies required to deliver them.
