3. METHODS

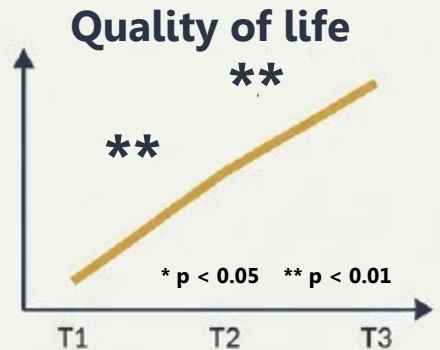
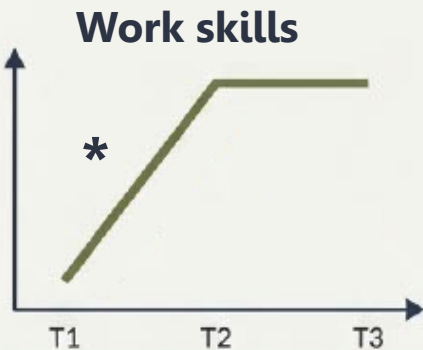

Correlation at T3: $r = .30$ ($p < .01$)
