

How to Purchase BTS Rabbit Card in Bangkok

Bangkok is serviced by the BTS Skytrain and the MRT train systems (over and under the ground). You can buy the BTS Rabbit Stored Value Card (pictured above) which will allow you to use the BTS Skytrain System only.

The BTS Skytrain mainly services downtown city areas and takes you from your hotel to BITEC (“**Bang Na Station**” E13 Exit 1); the WFOT 2026 congress venue.

To buy a Rabbit Card head to any BTS Skytrain station ticket office with your **passport**, pay approximately THB 200 (THB 100 fee + THB 100 initial stored value), and get your standard Adult card; the first-time registration must be done in person at the counter. You may top up your card at stations.



Foreign nationals are required to present their passports to register and purchase a Rabbit card.

Here's a step-by-step guide:

1. **Go to a BTS Station:** Visit the ticket office at any BTS Skytrain station in Bangkok.
2. **Bring Your Passport:** You'll need your physical passport for identification to register the card. One passport per Rabbit card only.
3. **Pay the Fees:** Prepare at least THB 200. This covers a non-refundable THB 100 issuance fee and a minimum THB 100 initial stored value. The recommended value of your first Rabbit card is THB 500 which should cover your use of the train for 5 days from your hotel to the congress venue; BITEC (“Bang Na Station” E13 Exit 1 on the light green [Sukhumvit Line](#)). Stored value cards are non-refundable, therefore don't top up more than you need.
4. **Get Your Card:** You'll receive a standard Adult Rabbit Card.
5. **Register (if required):** While you buy it at the counter, you might need to activate it or register via the My Rabbit App later; the app might prompt you to link your passport details.



Single Journey Tickets

Alternatively, you may opt to purchase a train ticket for each journey (single journey tickets). Automated vending machines are available at all stations. Fares are not flat and will depend on the distance you travel.

Key things to remember:

- **Fares:** The train fares start at THB 17 per person for a single stop and as much as THB 100 for long-distance journeys. A typical fare within city limits ranges from THB 25 - THB 55.
- **Where to Use:** BTS Sky Trains Only
- **Top-Ups:** Top up at BTS counters and partner locations.
- **Validity:** The stored value lasts 2 years after the last top-up/transaction.
- **BITEC station:** Bang Na Station E13 Exit 1 on the light green **Sukhumvit Line** (see map below)
